4. Title Transportation of waste on state waters

5. Summary/Purpose: The bill would eliminate the stacking limitation for containers on barges and would repeal the prohibition on transporting waste on the Rappahannock, James, and York Rivers. The bill also would broaden the Virginia Waste Management Board's authority to establish a waste barging fees schedule to fund not only the administrative and enforcement costs, but also to fund activities to abate pollution caused by barging of waste, to improve water quality, or for other water related purposes. In addition, the bill exempts from regulation recyclable construction demolition debris being transported directly to a processing facility for recycling or reuse.

6. Fiscal impact: There will be no additional costs associated with implementation of this legislation. The fees schedule associated with this legislation would be determined and implemented through the regulatory process and therefore the fiscal impact associated with this bill cannot be determined at this time.
