Summary/Purpose:** The bill provides for the Director of the Department of Professional and Occupational Regulation to authorize the use by licensed polygraph examiners of instruments other than polygraphs that record physiological changes pertinent to the determination of truthfulness or the verification of the truth of statements. The provisions of the bill expire on July 1, 2005. The bill is identical to HB2812.
