**4. Title:** Virginia Foundation for Healthy Youth; mission.

**5. Summary:** The proposed legislation expands the mission of the Virginia Foundation for Healthy Youth to include the reduction and prevention of substance use by youth in the Commonwealth.

**6. Budget Amendment Necessary:** No

**8. Fiscal Implications:** It is estimated that the Virginia Foundation for Healthy Youth will receive approximately \$9.3 million (8.5 percent) of Virginia's Master Settlement Agreement (MSA) payment annually. This funding is deposited into the Virginia Tobacco Settlement Fund (the Fund) which the Foundation uses to support educational and awareness programs aimed at restricting the use of tobacco products by minors and reducing childhood obesity (added by the 2009 General Assembly). This bill would expand the Foundation's mission such that the Fund would be able to support substance use prevention efforts. As the provisions of this bills do not require, but only allows, the Foundation to use revenue in the Fund for substance use prevention; it should not create the need for any additional resources.
